For many survivors, one incident of harassment or stalking may not be enough to show abuse or stalking. Documenting the abuse or stalking is one way for them to show law enforcement or judges that stalking and harassment is occurring. However, once law enforcement starts investigating tech-assisted crimes, what is the best way to collect the evidence? How does one preserve text messages, track an IP address, or seize a cell phone or computer? This webinar will explore some of these issues and provide tips and strategies on evidence collection.

This webinar will be most useful for law enforcement, community corrections, prosecutors, and civil attorneys for understanding how to secure evidence to support claims or protection orders on behalf of clients; and advocates so they can help the survivor start thinking about ways to preserve evidence.
